What if I told you that something as simple as having books at home—*from birth*—could change a child's life?



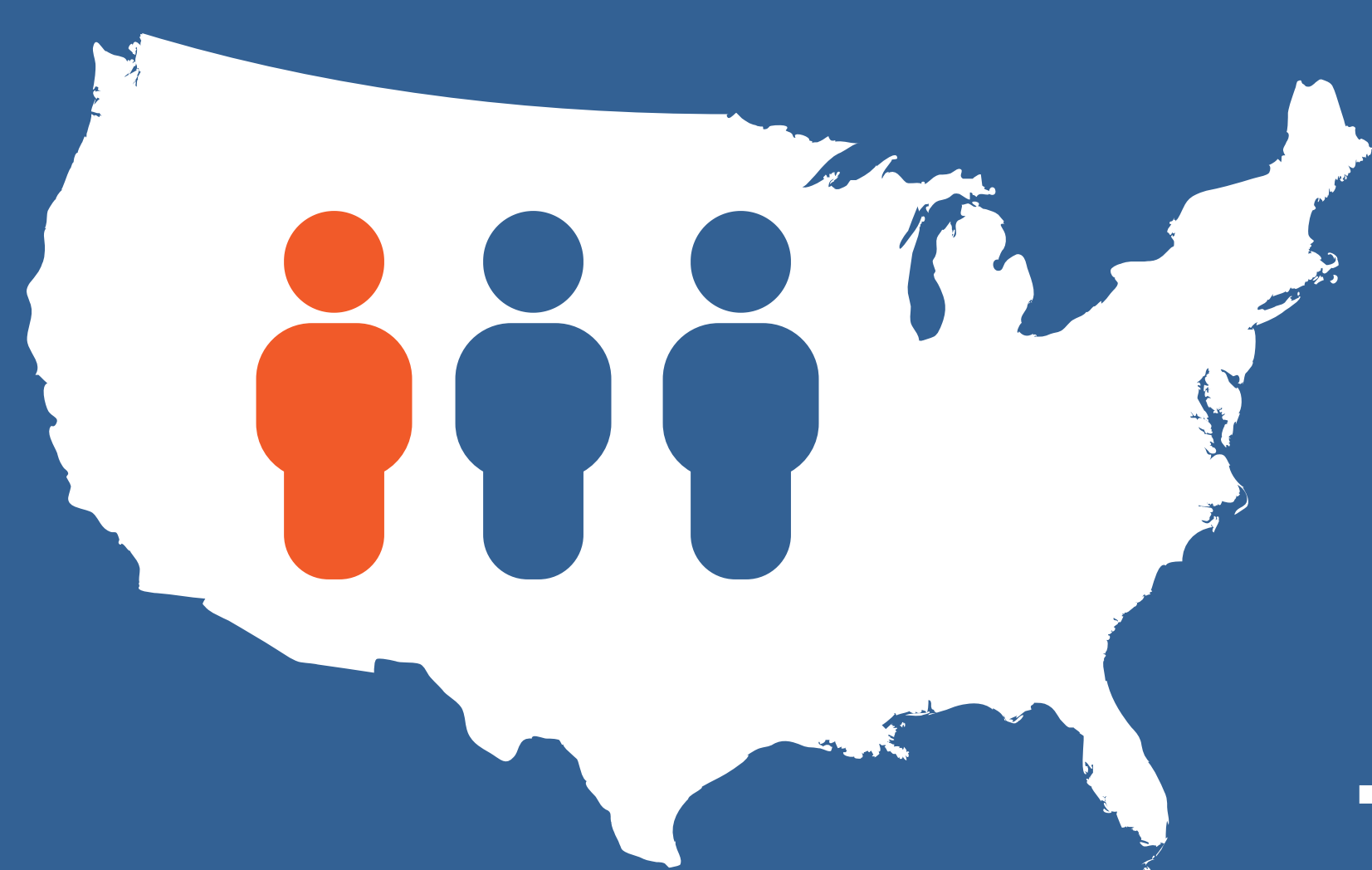
Literacy starts at

Plus, books in the home are the single biggest predictor of a child's reading skills and *long-term success in school*.

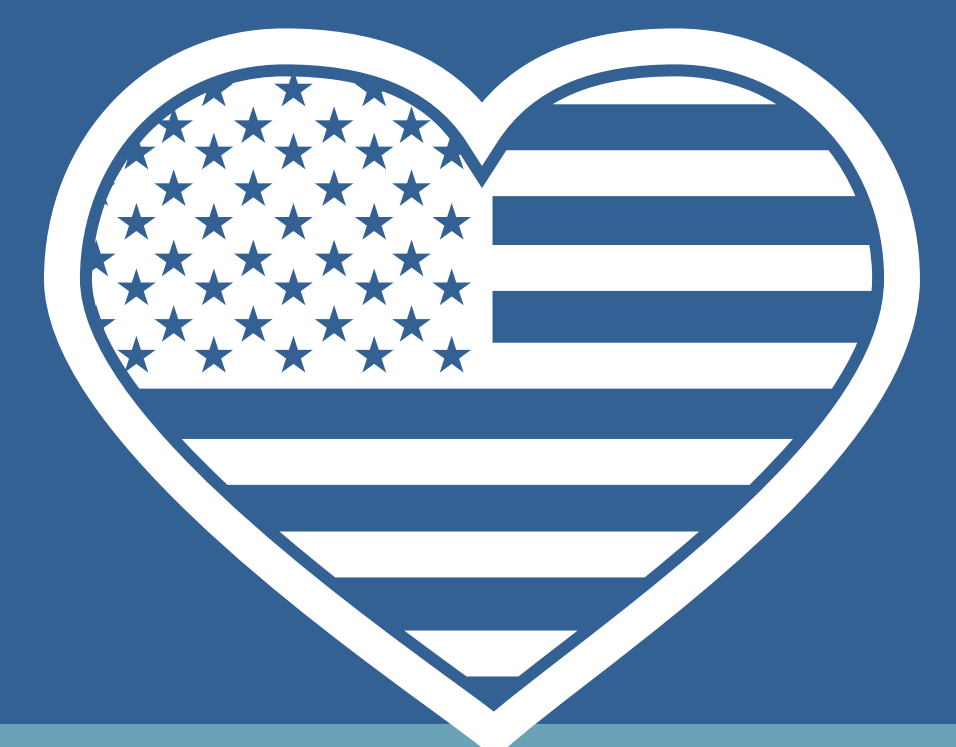


But here's the challenge: While the benefits to owning books are abundant, access isn't. Right now over *a third of U.S. children still have almost no books of their own* by fourth grade.

What if every single one of them received a starter home library from day one?

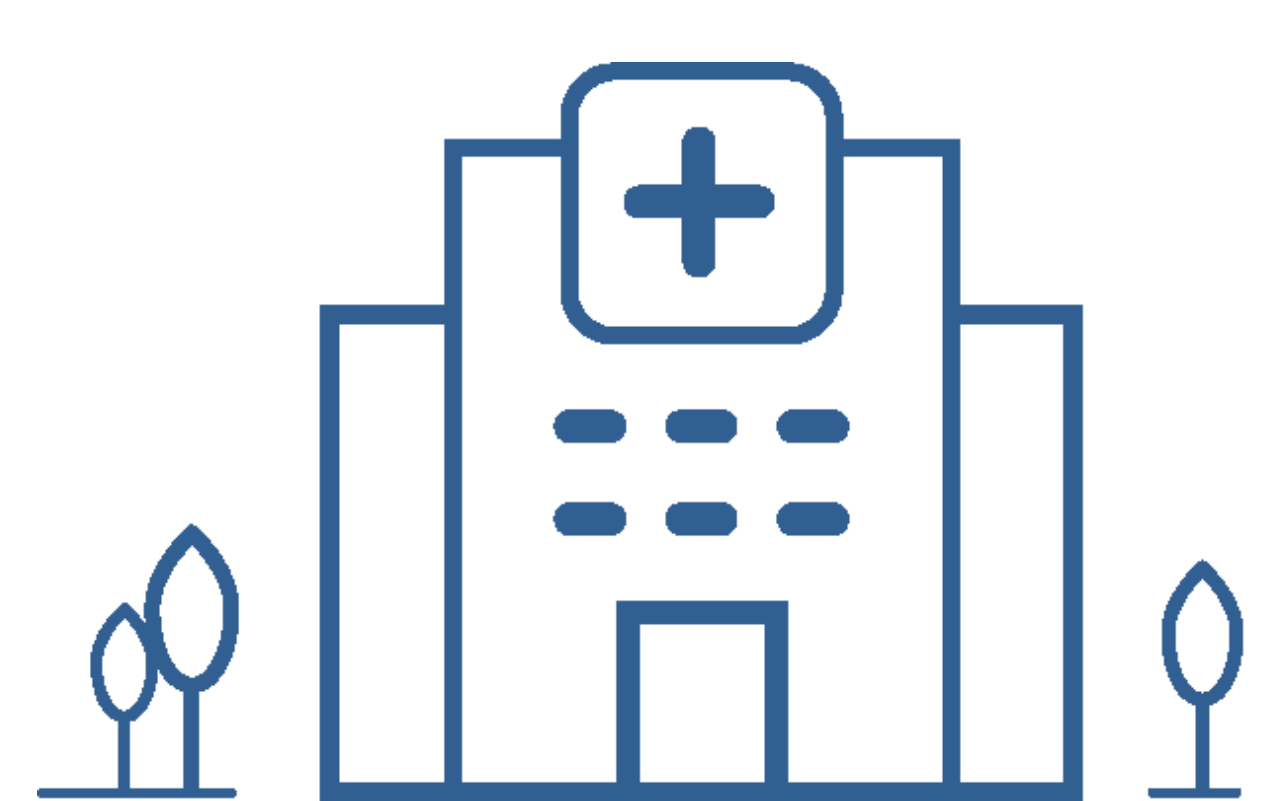
