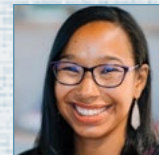

Book Harvest's vision of *Literacy and Justice for All* has never felt more compelling than it does right now.

At a time when our nation navigates complex shifts in culture and policy, we stand firmly grounded in the foundational truths that drive Book Harvest:

- *Literacy starts at birth, in the home, powered by parents, and nourished with books.*
- *The work to equip children and families with brimming home libraries over the spectacular first decade of life is a cherished privilege for the Book Harvest Board and staff.*
- *We hold an unshakeable belief in the spirit of joy and abundance – and in the transformative power of storytimes between parent and child. These are keys for early relational health – for connecting, learning, enduring, and thriving.*

2024 marked a year of extraordinary momentum toward our vision of literacy and justice for all.

This momentum powered the **293,365 books** harvested by families and children over the course of the year, to take home and keep forever (and in the **2,461,503 books** harvested since our founding in 2011!). And, as families built abundant home libraries starting at birth, we supported them in developing and sustaining self-determined habits of shared reading every step of the way.

This momentum earned recognition from our flagship city's Mayor, who proclaimed Durham as a "**City of Books**" – the first in the nation – when he cut the ribbon on our new and expanded headquarters in September.

And this momentum propelled Book Harvest across and beyond our home state of North Carolina with the expansion of two scaled impact initiatives: **Books from Birth** and **Books on Break**. As this goes to press, we are excited to share that Book Harvest program expansions are in the works in Oregon and Tennessee!

We are both optimists, but, more than that, we are *determined* – determined to continue to build this movement with you to realize a simple but powerful goal: **book ownership for all children**.

Our babies and children deserve – and have – our full, determined support and commitment, at this time, and at all times. *Thank you for being a part of our story.*

Igniting Literacy for Every Newborn

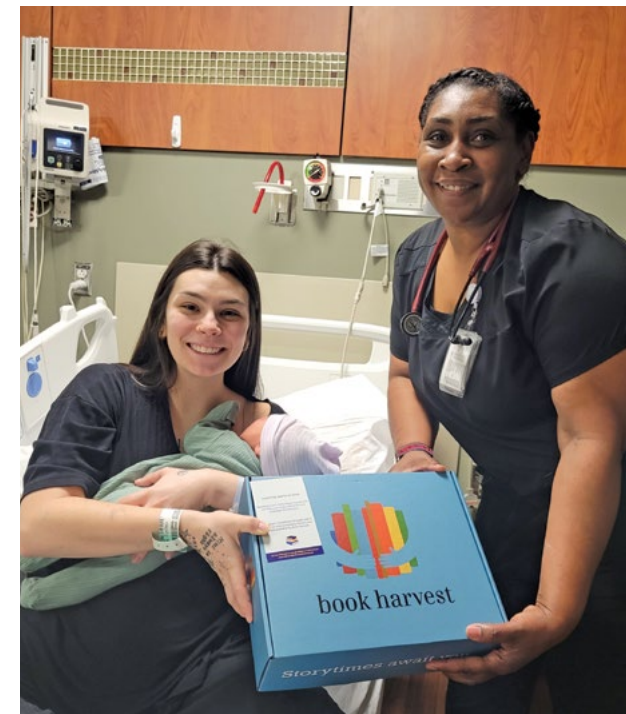
IN 2024

On October 1, 2024, Book Harvest and ECU Health Foundation launched Books from Birth at Maynard Children's Hospital in Greenville, North Carolina.

By the end of December 2024,

929 FAMILIES WITH NEWBORNS

had brought home a Books from Birth starter home library along with their bundle of joy. This partnership is on track to reach 4,300 newborns, including 1,400 babies in the NICU, and was made possible with funds from the State of North Carolina.

What it is:

Books from Birth partners with hospitals and health systems to provide families and their newborns with a starter home library of 10 brand new board books. These books come nestled in a special box that includes a onesie and a rich array of resources to support parents in establishing regular shared reading routines from Day One.

Why it matters:

Books from Birth equips parents with the necessary tool – books! – to lay the foundation for storytimes and for a lifetime of literacy for their child. When families have their own books, starting at birth, they are able to cultivate a habit of shared reading at home, an essential precondition for robust early relational health, school readiness, and a lifetime of flourishing.



14,440 BOOKS FILLED STARTER HOME LIBRARIES IN 2024!

In partnership with trusted messengers – among them, nurses and doctors – new parents took home **1,683 starter home libraries** filled with brand new books to jumpstart cozy reading routines at home with their newborns.

- > **PROGRAM CHAMPIONS:**
Nurses, obstetricians, pediatricians, and health professionals provided Books from Birth boxes to families in 2024.
- > **MEETING FAMILIES WHERE THEY ARE:**
In 2024, Books from Birth starter home libraries were embraced by families on birthing floors, in NICU units, at health departments, in WIC clinics, and more.
- > **LAYING THE GROUNDWORK FOR NATIONAL PROGRAM EXPANSION:**
Books from Birth ended 2024 with agreements to launch in 2025 with partners in Oregon and Tennessee.

BOOKS ON BREAK

Building Home Libraries for Summer Reading



IN 2024

Book Harvest brought Books on Break to 12,437 pre-K through 5th grade students in five counties across North Carolina. In a survey issued after the summer,

98% OF TEACHERS reported that caregivers were excited to read with their children over the 2024 summer break.

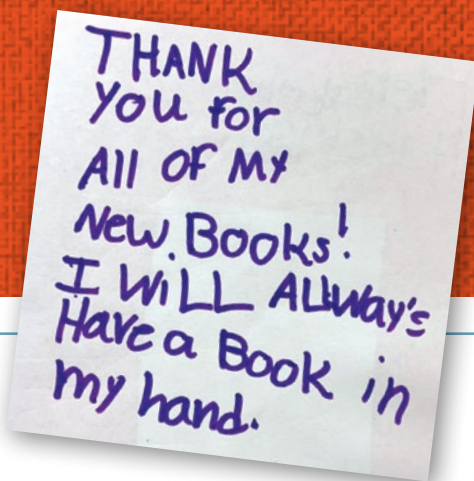

What it is:

Books on Break partners with school districts and summer learning initiatives to enable elementary school students to select 10 brand new books to take home and keep forever, right before summer break. Students take their books home in special string backpacks filled with additional resources and information for their families about ways to keep learning.



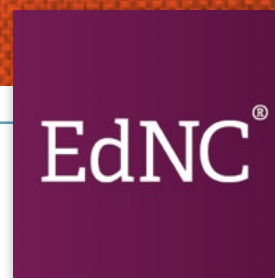
Why it matters:

Books on Break helps students build home libraries just before summer, a critical time for practicing reading and maintaining learning gains. During joyful Books on Break events, students get to choose their own books to take home and keep forever, building their identities as book owners and giving them abundant opportunities to practice the reading skills they worked so hard to gain during the school year.

12,437 STUDENTS IN 2024!

In **37 schools** across five North Carolina counties, elementary school students selected **101,340 books** to take home and keep forever at the end of the 2024 school year. Here's how their teachers and parents described the impact of the program:

- > **91% OF CAREGIVERS** said their child was "VERY" excited when they brought the books home.
- > **94% OF TEACHERS** reported that the program supports the literacy goals for the students over the summer months.
- > **92% OF TEACHERS** reported that their students were more motivated to read over the summer.

Under the leadership of Executive Director Tabitha Blackwell, Book Harvest Durham continued its contributions to Book Harvest's vision of *literacy and justice for all*. Book Harvest Durham serves as the organization's flagship location and demonstration city, exemplifying what is possible in a community that is devoted to books for every child and support for every parent.

On September 11, Durham Mayor Leonardo Williams cut the ribbon at Book Harvest's all-new 15,000-square-foot headquarters, welcoming all to our book-filled Family Space. Mayor Williams was joined by Durham Public Schools Superintendent Dr. Anthony S. Lewis, Book Harvest board and staff members, parents, volunteers, and dozens of children for this celebratory moment of shared commitment to every child's flourishing.

CREATING A COMMUNITY-WIDE CULTURE OF LITERACY

In 2024, Book Harvest Durham engaged the entire community to lead and participate, to learn and have fun. With an abundance of opportunities to harvest books to take home to read again and again and keep forever, children and parents built home libraries to develop shared reading routines, anchor identities as readers, and nourish hearts and mind.



Book Harvest Durham parent leaders and advocates – Susan English, DeAnna Vincent, and Tiara McCarter – guided staff in an informative discussion about “Centering Family Stories.”



Cherished community partners – from the Museum of Life and Science to The Wonder Lab and from Kids Voting Durham to the NC Museum of Art, among others – brought engaging family programs to the Book Harvest Durham’s Family Space.



These local FedEx employees were among the 32 volunteer teams from local businesses, schools, and community groups who brought their skills and passion to the task of sorting, stickering, and boxing the thousands of books that were donated to Book Harvest during the year.



Over the course of the year, Book Harvest Durham partnered with the county’s VA so that local veterans expecting newborns would receive a Books from Birth box. Those who served our country are being served with a starter home library at the VA’s celebratory baby showers.

BUILDING THE FIELD OF KNOWLEDGE AND ADVOCACY



In 2024, Book Harvest staff and board members traveled across the country – to 37 convenings! – sharing and learning, presenting and advocating. Media interviews, webinars, and published opinion pieces were among the many ways we spoke up, leaned in, and went the distance to share our vision of literacy and justice for all.



As a partner in North Carolina's new State Family Engagement Center, Book Harvest joined other SFECs from around the country at the annual conference hosted by the National Center for Families Learning in Louisville, KY. A full-house session devoted to engaging families in reading with their students over the summer months was led by Senior Director of Strategic Partnerships Isabel Geffner, Director of Advocacy Mary Mathew, Family Engagement Manager Alisa Miller, and Director of School and Family Engagement Amy Franks.

Book Harvest Durham Executive Director Tabitha Blackwell and Book Harvest Board member Dr. Iheoma Iruka joined a group of national leaders during a Campaign for Grade-Level Reading webinar devoted to amplifying the need for book abundance for every child everywhere.

Director of Advocacy Mary Mathew (2nd from right) was among the 60 2024 education policy fellows from NC who participated in the Institute for Educational Leadership's Washington Policy Seminar with others from across the country. In addition to learning and networking, she visited Capitol Hill to advocate for policies that support the flourishing of all students.

Book Harvest Founder and CEO Ginger Young (2nd from left) joined fellow leaders at the 2024 National Summer Learning Association Summit in Washington, DC to discuss "Literacy for All: Building Partnerships for Youth Success," spotlighting the role of books in ensuring students can thrive during summer.
