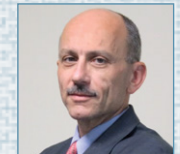

DEAR FRIENDS,

On a warm spring morning, a second grader—we'll call her Maya—stood in front of a table brimming with new books, turning each one over carefully in her hands. She had been told she could choose ten to take home. Ten books of her very own.

She chose stories about brave girls and curious scientists. She chose a mystery because she loved solving problems. She chose a book of jokes so she could make her little brother laugh. She chose a book of poems because it "felt special." When she finished painstakingly selecting her stack, she hugged it to her chest and said, "These are mine."

That moment captures the heart of Book Harvest.

In 2025, children like Maya harvested 485,562 books to keep for their very own. With every book, every child forged their identity as a reader. Their pride in owning books was nurtured. The foundation of their vocabulary, curiosity, empathy, and so much more grew stronger.

None of this could have happened without you.

In 2025, dedicated champions for children's literacy came together for thousands of children like Maya. Book Harvest volunteers contributed more than 4,500 hours of their time; 704 individual donors, along with foundation and public partners, invested in the simple belief that **books should be on every child's nightstand and literacy should be within every child's reach.**

We were honored this year when Books from Birth was recognized by the Library of Congress, and when we received the 2025 Social Impact Award from *Durham Magazine*. We were affirmed this year when we met with elected officials on both sides of the aisle on Capitol Hill and closer to home in Raleigh, hearing again and again their fierce commitment to every child's flourishing. We were inspired this year by all the ways parents showed up for their children – in our Book Harvest Durham Family Space, at our events, and snuggling alongside their child to read just one more story. And we were uplifted by the abundance and joy present throughout it all.

This year's progress rests on a strong and sturdy foundation built over 15 years. Since 2011, **three million Book Harvest books** have found their way into children's hands, hearts, and homes. Each one represents possibility. Each one says to a child: your story matters; you are a reader.

Thank you for helping to create more moments like Maya's—moments that bring joy and celebrate book ownership and boundless potential. Thank you for making 2025 a year of extraordinary impact.

We hope you will join us in writing the next chapter of the Book Harvest story. **Together, we can create a book-rich first decade for every child in our country.**

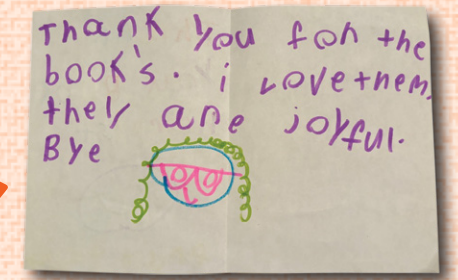

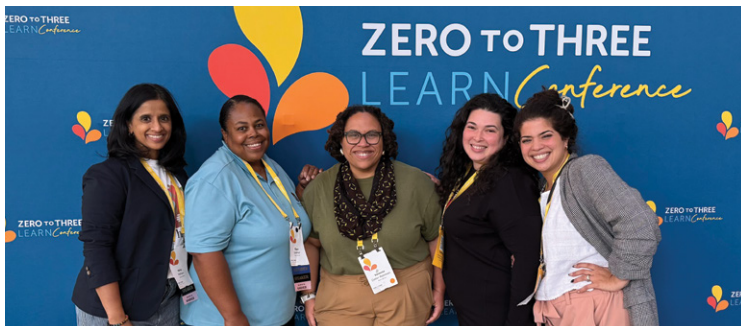
